We are proud of the meaningful teaching and learning that has taken place amidst all the excitement.

The large turnout truly shows the strong support we have from our parents, guardians, and community. This year, we are shifting our focus from math to literacy for our smart goal. We have seen positive growth in our math initiatives and are excited to concentrate on the University of Florida Literacy Initiative (UFLI) program, which we began last year. This systematic program teaches foundational skills necessary for proficient reading and will be implemented in our younger grades, with support for grades 4-8. Mrs. Scragg, our Dreamcatcher Literacy Coach, is receiving ongoing training in these programs and will share her expertise with our teachers, ensuring our students experience success in Language Arts. We will continue our efforts in math, where we've seen significant progress over the past four years, and will also incorporate the division's new Experiential Play initiative, allowing students to engage in hands-on learning.

Extracurricular activities are thriving! Ms. Risling's Cross Country team has participated in three meets and will conclude the season at Spruce Home on October 1, representing our school proudly. We also have three volleyball teams actively practicing and competing.

Our grade 3/4 students recently enjoyed a field trip to Batoche, and we are proud of their exemplary behavior and engagement. The staff at Batoche commended our students, reflecting the wonderful support we have from our families. Thank you for your commitment to fostering such positive behavior.

Looking ahead, our Coop Card Fundraiser kicks off on October 4. We aim to raise funds for activities, field trips, technology, and other resources to support our literacy goal. Students will have the chance to earn prizes for their efforts. The Coop Cards allow you to donate while receiving the full value back in cards, making it a great opportunity for everyone involved. We are grateful to Lake Country Coop for their continued support, which helps make these initiatives possible. Last year, we exceeded our fundraising goals, and we're excited to do it again!


Scholastic Book Fair

We sure love our Boston Pizza lunches here at West Central! With our online payment system, ordering is easier than ever! Our next lunch will be October 10th and then again on October 25th.





Edsby Information




