It has been a fantastic start to our school year. We have accomplished many great things and are excited to experience the rest of the year. Our staff's goal is to strengthen engagement within our parent, family, and school community. We have noticed an increase in the connections we're making and in the number of people attending our events.

Our Coop Card Fundraiser was a massive success! We sold over \$66,000 worth of cards, allowing us to easily reach our goal. A big thanks to Lake Country Coop for their support, as well as to Mrs. Bradbury and Mrs. LaFaver for organizing all the money and cards. We will be using these funds to support technology and various activities in and out of the school. Our school greatly appreciates all who supported us and adapted to the new timing of our fundraiser.

Our school teams have either completed or are nearing the end of their seasons. Mrs. Either's team finished their season at the Cross-Country Extravaganza at Spruce Home, consistently placing high in their categories and achieving fourth place among all small schools. The volleyball teams have shown great success, fantastic sportsmanship, and have served as excellent ambassadors for our school. This year, our coaches formed three teams rather than the usual two. A big thanks to Miss Scragg, Mr. Milligan, and Miss Blanchard for their dedication and for going the extra mile in coaching our teams.

We will hold our Remembrance Day Ceremony on November 7th. It will include a brief ceremony to honor those who have sacrificed for our freedom. The students will contribute with songs and poems, and parents/guardians are welcome to attend. The ceremony will begin around 11:00 a.m.

Progress Conferences will take place on Thursday, November 7th. Although this is a great opportunity to discuss student progress, we encourage parents/guardians to continue tracking their child's growth on Edsby, where they can see the different assessments and activities completed so far. We welcome communication with teachers or staff about any concerns and believe that consistent engagement among all stakeholders leads to a positive school experience for all students.



#### **Allergy Awareness**

# Volunteering Operation Red Nose Benefits Prince Albert Elementary Schools



Eleven Prince Albert elementary schools received \$8,800 from the 2023 Operation Red Nose campaign to assist with their programming. The Prince Albert Lions Club will be sponsoring Operation Red Nose in Prince Albert again in 2024 and is looking for volunteers to make it a successful campaign to keep the city streets safer. Community volunteers are the key to the success of the program. In 2023 we provided 170 rides to 377 clients who were impaired or who did not feel fit to drive their own vehicle. They all got home safely. Although the service is free, clients usually provide donations, which under the provisions of the Operation Red Nose Program must be allocated to youth groups or groups that support youth in Prince Albert and area. The Prince Albert Lions Club has selected area elementary schools as the recipients of these donations to assist with programing for students. The program operates on Friday and Saturday evenings. This year will be starting on Friday, November 29th and run each Friday and Saturday to December 21st plus New Year's Eve. We start around 9 pm in the evening and usually run until around 2 am the next morning. New Year's tends to run a bit later due to house parties. Volunteers must be at least 19 years of age. They are organized into teams of 3 people, an escort driver, a designated driver and a navigator. All volunteers require a police background check (provided at no cost) and are insured for liability by our provincial sponsor the SGI. Volunteers do not have to use their vehicles since escort vehicles are provided by vehicle dealerships in the city. Volunteers can choose to work one night, a weekend or the whole season. Come as an individual or put together a team of 3 people. We find News Year Eve is one of our busiest nights. Volunteers are provided with food, coffee and camaraderie during the evenings they work.
